

OTB Operations at a Glance













The popular gaming floor at Batavia Downs Gaming & Hotel generates the most profit for the corporation. Patrons love the video lottery gaming machines.


Reducing Local Property Taxes

There's no question — the pandemic hit hard and fast. Money sent to our member counties and cities took a sharp decline in 2020. Yet, operations continued, and in 2021, just months after the bottom fell out, OTB regained its footing and was able to send more money back to the counties and cities than ever before. Projections for 2022 are even more promising and we're looking to break more records as we continue our mission to reduce local property taxes.

It's important to note that this money is an additional income stream for our member counties and cities that use this revenue to reduce local property taxes.

After paying betters their winnings, about half of the remaining profits go to the state to pay for education. The other half goes to pay for revenues distributed to our 15 member counties and the cities of Buffalo and Rochester, OTB operations, and the horse racing industry.

Our Legal and "Statutory Objective"

The Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTBC) is one of five regional OTB corporations established and financed by their respective municipal sponsors following the enactment of permissive legislation by New York State in 1973.

WROTBC is an established "public benefit corporation," in that, it provides revenues to its member municipalities. Its geographical area is comprised of 18 counties, 15 of which participate as members of WROTBC, including the two cities of Buffalo and Rochester. The statutory objective of WROTBC is:

- 1) To prevent and curb illegal bookmaking while providing a reasonable revenue stream for the support of government.
- 2) To promote the well-being of horse racing and breeding industries in New York State.
- To facilitate the local economy by providing employment to its residents.

Independent Audit Results in "Clean Opinion" and WROTB's "financial position is in a very good spot."

An independent audit of the Western New York Off-Track Betting Corp. revealed "a clean opinion" with no internal control material weaknesses, according to a certified public accountant with The Bonadio Group.

Randy Shepard, speaking at this morning's WROTB board of directors meeting at the Park Road facility, said the corporation's accounting procedures and financial position are in good order.

"From an overall perspective, we did issue an unmodified, or a clean, audit opinion. That's the highest level of assurance that we can give from an audit perspective," Shepard reported. "And that's

"The highest level of assurance that we can give from an auditing perspective." very important, as you go to bonding – and this year you did go out to bond – that having a clean opinion impacts your interest rates and things like that. So, a very good process."

Shepard also said the audit did not identify any material weaknesses in internal control and made no adjustments to financial figures.

He credited CFO Jacquelyne Leach and her staff for their accuracy in keeping the books. Responding to WROTB President Henry Wojtaszek's request to talk about the corporation's balance sheeting coming out of the COVID-19

pandemic, Shepard said, "The rebound has been very nice."

"Obviously, for the organization, volumes and patron activity levels have been higher here. And that really is demonstrated on the balance sheet in terms of where your cash position is. Your liabilities and your debt are much more manageable now that you've refinanced. So, I think your financial position is in a very good spot."

Wojtaszek said he and the board are "ecstatic" with the audit report.

"We have no issues with in terms of internal controls or anything with our financial statements. They're clean," he said after the meeting. "There are no issues and in terms of our balance sheet, and we are in a fantastic financial position at Batavia Downs -- especially coming out of a pandemic. We are really in a great financial position."

When asked if the audit addressed some of the problems found by the New York State Comptroller's Office regarding the distribution of sports tickets and the use of company vehicles for the years 2017-19, Wojtaszek said all of those issues have been rectified.

"Again, we invited the Comptroller here in the first place," he said. "We had resolved the majority if not all of the issues even before they came here, and so we feel very comfortable with them coming in here and anything they had pointed out. We were looking for any good advice and we took that advice."

State, local officials address problem gaming BATAVIA: Options for patrons discussed at Batavia Downs

Gambling addiction is an issue for roughly 2 million adults in the United States. In Batavia and around New York State, gaming providers say they're making an effort to address the issue. New York State Gaming Commission Executive Director Robert Williams said as many as 3%

or more than 6 million adults in the U.S., have mild or moderate gaming problems.

"It's our job as gaming regulators, administrators, operators, public health administrators and advocacy groups to join with the National Council (on Problem Gaming) to shine a light on the very real problem and issue of

problem gambling and the millions of individuals nationwide who continue to gamble for reasons other than entertainment," Williams said during a discussion Thursday at Batavia Downs.

"What is responsible gaming?" was the title of Thursday's presentation, he said. Williams said the answer depends on where a person sits. "For the player, it might mean not using gambling as a source of income, gambling only with money you can afford to lose or setting time or money limits for gambling," he said. "For the operator, it may mean prevention with the goal of stopping problem gambling behaviors from developing. For the treatment provider, it might mean ensuring that there are resources and treatment options for those who seek assistance."

Williams debuted signage featuring the industry's first-ever Quick Response (QR) Code to connect problem gamblers with trained problem gambling clinicians where they live, in real time. Once scanned, the QR Code automatically links users to the Council on Problem Gambling's website, which provides access to a network of Regional Problem

Gambling Resource centers. The QR

Code is available on advertising and promotional materials the Gaming Commission and its licensees issue.

"We take it very seriously at Batavia Downs and we appreciate the support of the Gaming Commission and other agencies to help us do that," CEO Henry Wojtaszek said. Staff will take concerns to on-duty management to see if the situation needs to be looked into further and to explain the options a patron with a problem-gaming issue has.

"If you walk around the gaming floor, you'll see the decals on every device that promotes New York's HOPEline," he said. "Our security and floor staff have information on any of those topics if our patrons want to find that out. If they need more statewide information, we'll give that to them as well. Each one of our promotional mailings that we send out reminds people to play responsibly."

The HOPEline number is 1-877-8-HOPENY (467369). HOPEline services are free and confidential.


